HORTICULTURE BUILDING AT LANSDOWNE PARK

ABOUT THIS PROJECT

Project involved a complete retrofit to re-purpose the heritage building to a multifunctional occupancy, while maintaining its original heritage charm.

- + As Canada's largest Heritage building move, the building was moved 140 metres across the Lansdowne Park redevelopment site to its new location.
- + Installed mechanical and electrical systems to create a unique public multi-use space.
- + Hot water radiant floor heat is provided through the entire open area.
- + A single packaged make-up air system provides ventilation throughout the building.
- + Added public washrooms to serve the new multi-functional occupancy.
- + Provided standalone mechanical services for the front retail spaces.
- + Added an electric distribution system and kitchen to the Horticulture Building.
- + Installed a dimmable, addressable lighting control system to the kitchen, allowing for the lighting to configured to the use of the space.
- + Provided separate metered services to the retail components located on the first and second floors of the Horticulture Building.
