ABOUT THIS PROJECT

Fort Ware, BC

LOCATION

+ New emergency response and learning centre constructed to provide essential services for the Kwadacha First Nation community in Fort Ware, BC.

SMITH + ANDERSEN SERVICES PROVIDED

+ The single-storey wood-building consists of two separate facilities: an emergency response centre, with single vehicle bay, gear room, and tool room, and an adult learning centre, with reception, three classrooms, a lounge area, washrooms, and an office.

Mechanical, Electrical, Intelligent Integrated Systems

+ Designed to be a recognizable point of emergency for the community.

KEY TEAM MEMBERSUnison Architecture

+ Due to the remote location, the structure was constructed from durable materials, and features low-maintenance finishes and high-performance fibreglass windows.

SIZE

+ Classified as a post-disaster building and can act as an emergency command centre.

4,660 sq. ft. (430 sq. m.)

+ This First Nations project required close collaboration with the Kwadacha Nation to create a structure that met their needs.

BUDGET

+ Client requested a simple mechanical system to accommodate the remote location and straight-forward operational requirements.

- + Mechanical design scope included plumbing, drainage, fire protection, and HVAC.
- + Remote location required close collaboration throughout the design process, particularly when arranging services and utilities.
