



CENTENNIAL PARK PAN AM BMX CENTRE

ABOUT THIS PROJECT

- + 3.2-hectare Centennial Park originally opened in 1967.
- + In July 2015, the new BMX extension (Centennial Park Pan Am BMX Centre) was completed, hosting Toronto's Pan Am Games' BMX competitions.
- + Extension included a 350-metre track, and a fixed eight-metre ramp designed to the certification standards of the Union Cycliste Internationale (UCI).
- + Adjacent service building was also constructed.
- + After the games ended, the centre along with a newly constructed five-metre ramp became accessible to the public.
- + Receptacles are provided along the track, as well an empty conduit system under the track for video cabling, temporary feeds, and timing loops.
- + Additional distribution equipment was added to accommodate the power and lighting for the track and new storage building.
