





MCMASTER UNIVERSITY DAVID BRALEY HEALTH SCIENCES CENTRE

- + Six-storey health sciences building at the core of McMaster's new satellite campus and a significant contributor to the revitalization of downtown Hamilton, Ontario.
- + Centre includes eleven classrooms on the second floor and 48 exam rooms on the third floor to accommodate approximately 550 staff members.
- + Home to the Michael G. DeGroote School of Medicine's Department of Family Medicine and the City of Hamilton's Public Health Services, the facility combines healthcare staff with medical students for a more authentic learning experience.
- + Features a two-storey, light-filled atrium with a series of public spaces that cascade to the top of the building.
- Audio-visual team designed the presentation, collaboration, video conferencing, sound reinforcement, and digital signage systems for the tiered lecture hall, divisible classrooms, and a variety of meeting spaces.
- Technology was closely integrated with architecturally sensitive spaces and consultations with user groups led to increased audio-visual functionality while maintaining project budget and timelines.
- + Includes a street-level bistro, informal meeting areas, office space, indoor gardens, amphitheater, maternity, family and public health clinics, and seminar and teaching facilities.
- Architectural details such as the stone, wood, fountains, and planting features reflect the geological elements of the Niagara escarpment and the building's LEED[®] Gold target.
